



## IAFA Annual Conference Dublin City University Business School 11<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> May 2006

### First Call for Papers

The 19<sup>th</sup> annual conference of the **Irish Accounting and Finance Association (IAFA)** will be hosted by Dublin City University (DCU) on Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> and Friday 12<sup>th</sup> May 2006. The association invites submission of papers on any topic related to accounting and finance, including: management accounting, financial accounting, finance, auditing, taxation, accounting education, accounting history, public sector accounting and social and environmental accounting. The conference plenary speaker will be Professor Keith Hoskin, University of Warwick.

#### Submission of papers/abstracts

Three copies of complete papers or abstracts should be sent to the address below, to arrive not later than **28<sup>th</sup> February 2006**. Earlier submission is encouraged and full papers will be prioritised. Each submission should include an abstract on a single page (single-spaced, in font size 12), indicating clearly the title of the paper, author(s), affiliation(s), and postal and email addresses. The corresponding/presenting author(s) should also be clearly identified.

Authors will be notified of acceptance by **31<sup>st</sup> March, 2006**. As abstracts of accepted papers will be published in the conference programme, an electronic copy of abstracts will be requested at a later date. Accepted papers will only be included in the conference schedule if conference registration and payment of at least one author has been received by **18<sup>th</sup> April 2006**.

#### IAFA Scholar

The IAFA invites submission of papers from new researchers to be considered for the IAFA Scholar Award. The eligibility criteria and submission details for this competition are posted online ([www.iafa.ie](http://www.iafa.ie)).

#### Conference registration
