

Timothy J. Rupert is the James Carey Fellow at the College of Business, Northeastern University. Professor Rupert earned his PhD in Accounting at Pennsylvania State University and his MS in Taxation and BS in Accounting at University of Akron, Ohio. Professor Rupert's research interests include cognitive and decision making processes of taxpayers and tax practitioners. His research uses behavioral methodologies to examine the impact of changes in the structure of the tax system on decision making and fairness perceptions. His publications have appeared in *Advances in Taxation*, *Advances in Accounting Education*, *The Tax Advisor*, *The Journal of the American Taxation Association (JATA)*, and *The Journal of Accounting and Finance Research*.

Professor Rupert has twice been selected as the Teacher of the Year for Beta Gamma Sigma and in 2010 was recognized with the Educator of the Year Award recipient from the Massachusetts Society of Certified Professional Accountants. He has been actively involved in the ATA for many years. During this period he has served as President Elect, Vice-President, Secretary, Trustee, and on the Editorial Board of *JATA*.
