

# CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS 2010 OHIO REGION MEETING of the AMERICAN ACCOUNTING ASSOCIATION

May 6 – 8, 2010  
Hyatt on Capital Square Columbus, Ohio

Accounting educators, students and professionals are invited to submit completed manuscripts and ideas for panels or workshops for presentation at the 51<sup>st</sup> Annual Meeting of the Ohio Region of the American Accounting Association. Papers may encompass any topical area of accounting and may be theoretical or practice-oriented. Accounting education papers and cases are strongly encouraged for submission. All papers submitted will be sent out for blind review.

The 2010 meeting will be held in Columbus, Ohio at the Hyatt on Capital Square. The hotel is located downtown and across from the capital at 75 East State Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215. A limited number of hotel rooms have been set aside for conference participants at the rate of \$119 per night single occupancy and \$129 per night double occupancy. Free parking is available for those staying at the Hyatt. Academics and professionals from the Ohio region, as well as those from other regions and overseas, are welcome to participate. CPE credit will be available.

### ***Paper Awards:***

Prizes will be given for the Best Paper (the Andrews Distinguished Paper Award) and the Best Teaching, Learning and Curriculum (TLC) Paper.

### ***Paper Submissions:***

Papers by academics or professionals should be sent to Program Chair Dr. Jan Eighme of Miami University ([eighmeje@muohio.edu](mailto:eighmeje@muohio.edu); or (513) 529-6224). While one person may submit multiple papers, due to scheduling and space limitations, each person may present no more than two papers (but may be a co-author of papers that other people present).

Submissions should be sent via email (Word). All papers submitted must include an abstract and should be double-spaced, using a 12-point type, and have 1" margins all around. Do not include a cover page or any author identification in the document you submit. However, your e-mail should contain the following for each author: Name(s), Position/Title Affiliation, Complete mailing address, Office telephone number, E-mail address. Be sure in your email to indicate the contact author for your submission. Please specify from the list below the topic area of your paper:

The submission deadline is **January 31, 2010**. Early submissions are strongly encouraged.

Notification of acceptance will be sent no later than March 15, 2010. At least one author of an accepted paper must register for the meeting and present the paper. Paper and panel presentations will take place all day Friday, and until about noon on Saturday.

The winner will receive a \$500 prize, a plaque, and a free dinner at the conference.

Papers should be sent by March 1, 2010 to the appropriate selection committee chair.

The opening Friday plenary session will feature the President and CEO of the Ohio Society of CPAs, J. Clarke Price, discussing the “Status of the Profession and an Ohio Accounting Update.”

The Friday luncheon speaker will be Nancy A. Baganoff, Dean, College of Business and Public Administration, Old Dominion University, and current AAA President. Friday afternoon’s program will include a panel of journal editors.

Saturday morning panels will explore the theme “Accounting in a Global Economy.”
