## **President-Elect:**

## Tawei (David) Wang, DePaul University

Tawei (David) Wang is currently an Associate Professor and Driehaus Fellow at DePaul University. He received his Ph.D. from Krannert Graduate School of Management, Purdue University in 2009. His research interests are information security management and IT management. His papers have appeared in several leading journals, including Accounting Horizons, Decision Support Systems, European Journal of Information Systems, Information and Management, Information Systems Journal, Information Systems Research, International Journal of Accounting Information Systems, Journal of Accounting and Public Policy, Journal of Banking and Finance, Journal of Information Systems, among others. He mainly teaches accounting information systems, audit data analytics and data mining. He is currently listed on the Fulbright Specialist Roster for developing analytics curriculum for accounting programs. He spoke at universities and conferences around the world as well as events hosted by the Institute of Internal Auditors and the Institute of Management Accountants. He was invited to be a panelist by the Federal Reserve Bank Charlotte and to be a keynote speaker for the Financial Supervisory Commission in Taiwan. He was selected to be the KPMG James Marwick Professor in Residence in 2018 and is the out-going president of the AAA Midwest Region.

## Deniz Appelbaum, Montclair State University

Dr. Deniz Appelbaum (appelbaumd@montclair.edu), Assistant Professor of the Department of Accounting and Finance at the Feliciano School of Business of Montclair State University enriches her academic pursuits with a practical view, after twenty years of experience in operations, credit, and business development in the corporate world. Dr. Appelbaum has published manuscripts in *Accounting Horizons, Journal of Emerging Technologies in Accounting, Auditing: Journal of Practice and Theory*, and in other academic and practitioner journals, based on her research regarding analytics, big data, and automation in financial auditing and fraud detection. She has two decades of entrepreneurial and higher education experiences, including more than ten years in academic leadership roles within the American Accounting Association (AIS & TLC sections), the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants (CPA Evolution BAR Taskforce Co-Chair & APBP initiative trainer) and the Institute of Management Accountants (local board member & CAR taskforce). Most recently, she served as the program chair for the first virtual TLC colloquium and worked with TLC leadership and speakers to bring interactive and engaging sessions to members.

## Matt Pickard, Northern Illinois University

## Research and Publications Committee (1 position):

## Daniel E. O'Leary, University of Southern California

Daniel E. O'Leary is a tenured full professor at the University of Southern California (USC), in the Leventhal School of Accounting. He received his Ph. D. from Case Western Reserve University in 1986 and formerly worked with KPMG in their consulting practice. Dan teaches in the area of accounting information systems (AIS), focused primarily on the Master of Accounting program and USC's accounting data and analytics program, in which he teaches two courses.

Dan has been a long-time supporter of the Journal of Information Systems (JIS), both as a part of the editorial board and as a contributor. Professor O'Leary's first paper in JIS was in 1988 and his most recent JIS paper is forthcoming. Dan has been on the JIS editorial board, in various positions, since 1991. Professor O'Leary also has been very active in the editorial space of information systems, artificial intelligence and AIS, with previous experience as an editor of four journals. In addition, Dan currently is a senior editor (2 journals), an associate editor (1 journal) and on the editorial board of 10 other journals.

Dan has also been active in supporting AIS research in other activities. For example, he has been a presenter at a number of previous American Accounting Association National Meetings and AIS midyear meetings. Further, he was the chair of the AIS Section Midyear meeting in 2018. In addition, he has been the program chair of the Pre-ICIS workshops for the SIG-ASYS in 2018 - 2020.
