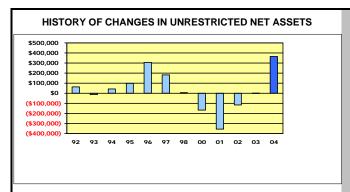
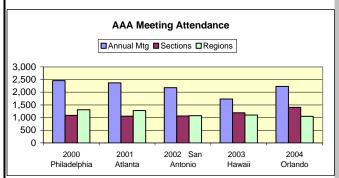
## Key Performance Indicators American Accounting Association After Fiscal Year Ending 8/31/04

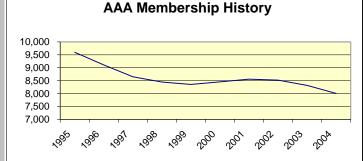

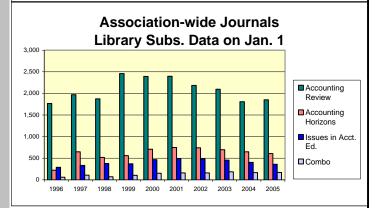
The fiscal year ending 8/31/04 showed an overall balance sheet improvement for the association as a whole. The \$50 dues increase implemented this year provided the General Fund with an additional \$235,743 while membership decreased 5% and most Sections have seen their fund balances increase as well. Net inflows from the three main journals were higher than predicted and admin. expenses were less than budgeted.



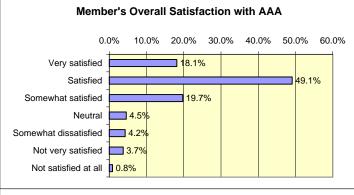

The membership chart above shows a steady decline in membership from year to year with the exception of a temporary influx of new members in the 2001-02 period when membership promotion campaign was initiated with the help of a marketing company. The AAA/APLG PHD Shortage Project will help us to better understand that trend. The library subscription chart shows a consistent decline in subscritions to hard copy association-wide journals which will change with the advent of electronic library access.
