

Steps in the Dissertation Process

- **STEP 1:** Accept responsibility.
- **STEP 2:** Define the project.
- **STEP 3:** Assemble your team.
- **STEP 4:** Break the project into smaller parts.
- **STEP 5:** Accomplish the parts.
- **STEP 6:** Treat yo self.



Step 1: Accept Responsibility

Put your destiny in your own hands!

- Admit that **you** have a problem project.
 - "Do or do not. There is no try." Yoda

You will reap what you sow.



Step 2: Define the Project

- What is a "dissertation?"
 - A solo-authored research paper.
 - Requirement to receive a Ph.D.
 - Working paper/potential future publication on your vita.
 - Job market paper.



Step 2: Define the Project

- What is a "dissertation?"
 - Your grand entrance into the world of accounting research!
 - A chance to become an expert in a topic you truly find interesting.
 - A chance to contribute to *accounting knowledge*.




Step 3: Assemble Your Team

- Identify a dissertation chair as early as you possibly can.
- Identify committee members.
- Make them invested and interested in you before you even ask!!

• Communicate with them often.

Step 4: Manageable Parts

- Come up with a basic idea and write it up.
- Generate a well-developed research proposal.
- Data analysis.
- Full first draft.
-879th draft.



- Set deadlines for each part and hold yourself accountable for them.
 - Regular meetings with committee members.

• Procrastination will ruin your chance at greatness.




The Timeline: It's Kind of Scary

• Come up with an idea.






- Generate a well-developed research proposal.

 - Hypothesis development
 - Methods




This will be your life...





And occasionally, you'll have to interact with the outside world...





- Data Analysis
 - Visualize primary tables
 - Replicate the sample, descriptives, and main results of related papers
 - Slowly turn the dial until you get to your unique specification
 - Some robustness, but it's OK to leave some for future (10th, 11th, etc.) draft




• Turn your first draft in to your committee!
