### **Vice President/President-Elect – Peter Kipp**

*Peter Kipp is an associate professor of accounting in the G. Brint Ryan College of Business, University of North Texas. Dr. Kipp earned his Ph.D. at the University of South Florida, his Master in Professional Accounting from the The University of Texas at Austin, and his BBA from Pittsburg State University. His general research interests include AIS and auditing topics with a behavioral and decision making focus. His research received the "Outstanding Research Award" for the 2017 Joint Midyear Meeting of the AIS and SET Sections of the American Accounting Association. Dr. Kipp maintains an active CPA license in the state of Kansas.*

### **Secretary – Jennifer Hamrick**

*Dr. Jennifer D. Hamrick, CPA, CFE, is an Assistant Professor of Accounting at the Collat School of Business, The University of Alabama at Birmingham. Her teaching portfolio spans External Audit, Advanced Audit, Advanced Financial Accounting, and AI and Society, preparing students to navigate both the technical and ethical dimensions of the accounting profession. Dr. Hamrick's research centers on governance, ethics, and professional decision-making in accounting, with a growing focus on emerging technologies and risk. Her work appears in a range of peer-reviewed journals, including Advances in Accounting, the Journal of Emerging Technologies in Accounting, the Annals of Public and Cooperative Economics, the Journal of Theoretical Accounting Research, and Research on Professional Responsibility and Ethics in Accounting, among others.*

### **Vice Treasurer – Juergen Sidgman**

*Juergen Sidgman (Ph.D., University of Nebraska-Lincoln) is an Assistant Professor of Accounting at the University of Alaska Anchorage, where he has taught since 2020. He previously held faculty positions at the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh and the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. His teaching spans financial accounting, auditing, and accounting information systems at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. Dr. Sidgman's research focuses on accounting information systems, audit team communication, data privacy, and data visualization. His work has appeared in the Journal of Information Systems, Current Issues in Auditing, and The CPA Journal, among other outlets. He has been an active contributor to the AIS community through manuscript reviewing, conference presentations, and leadership roles, including serving as AIS Educator Association Program Research Chair. He currently serves as AIS Section Historian and as Treasurer for the Strategic and Emerging Technologies (SET) Section of the American Accounting Association. Dr. Sidgman holds degrees from the University of Nebraska at Kearney (MBA) and Universidad Diego Portales in Santiago, Chile (B.A. in Accounting), and brings professional audit experience from his time at Grant Thornton in Chile.*

### **Vice Chair Research and Publications Committee – Lauren Cooper**

*Lauren Cooper is an Associate Professor of Accounting in the John Chambers College of Business and Economics at West Virginia University. Her research examines the impact of technologies, including artificial intelligence and robotic process automation, on the accounting profession and its stakeholders. Her coauthored paper, “Robotic Process Automation in Public Accounting,” received the AICPA/American Accounting Association 2023 Notable Contributions to Accounting Literature Award and Accounting Horizons 2020 Best Paper Award. She earned her Ph.D. in Business Administration from Oklahoma State University and is a Certified Public Accountant licensed in West Virginia.*

### **Nominations Committee – Christian Peters**

*Christian Peters is an Assistant Professor of Accounting and Information Systems at the University of Wisconsin–Madison, where his research and teaching explore how technology and data are transforming the accounting profession. He earned his PhD in Accounting (cum laude) from Tilburg University, and also holds degrees in BSc (IBA), MSc (Accounting), and MPhil (Business) from the same institution. He previously taught at Nanyang Technological University in Singapore and was a short-term research visitor at Emory University. Christian's research focuses among others on judgment and decision-making in auditing, primarily focusing on how emerging technologies (such as generative AI) are changing the auditing profession. He is also interested in corporate tax avoidance and its broader economic implications. His work has appeared in leading journals, including Accounting, Organizations and Society and Contemporary Accounting Research, and has been featured in outlets such as the Financial Times. Christian currently serves on the editorial board of Accounting Open. At University of Wisconsin–Madison, he teaches “Foundation in Accounting Analytics,” where he helps students develop the analytic mindset and technical skills needed to thrive in a data-driven profession.
